The other significant staffing matter that I'd like to bring to the Board and the public's attention is for years, the Academy has struggled with a significant vacancy rate, at times -- too frequent in times -- topping 60 percent vacancy rate, particularly as it relates to Law Enforcement Academy instructors.

I will tell you, after doing this job for a period of time, it literally takes the efforts of every person. And there is not a person that works here that doesn't contribute significantly to the products that we push out.

We undertook, almost immediately after I arrived here, an advocacy position with the State Personnel office for a classification and compensation study related to folks that work within the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy. We were able to successfully integrate an entirely new classification that adequately describes the work that is being done here by the licensed professionals that train our police officers and telecommunicators, also elevate them into a more competitive salary structure.

And I'm pleased to say that with those integrations, which have also happened during this

1 20 agencies, some of which are represented here 2 today, on November 15th. So very recently.

We graduated a Certification by Waiver of Previous Training Class No. 109, 12 police officers, on September 30th.

We also graduated a Public Safety Telecommunicator Class No. 157 that had 20 students November 4th.

And Monday morning, bright and early, Cert By Waiver Class 110 begins here at the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy with another group of police officers to be certified.

In addition to the certification of licensed professionals, an important point of emphasis and focus has been, for us, the advanced training on topics that are relevant and important to law enforcement and public safety professionals.

This agency sponsored, hosted, and funded a number of advanced training opportunities for New Mexico Public Safety personnel over the course of the summer and the fall. We'll summarize them for you quickly.

We conducted a nationally recognized expert training in fair and impartial policing in August. We also invited nationwide recognized

summer and this fall, we have been able to, starting at the first of this fiscal year -- so starting July 1 -- decrease our vacancy rate from a staggering close to 50 percent down to 26 percent. We have two positions that closed last week, and we

My goal is to come to you at our next meeting in '23 and be able to report that we're either in single digits or zero vacancy rate. If we're able to do that, it will be a significant accomplishment.

expect to fill those in the future.

I can tell you the effect is palpable here at the office related to the ability to spread out the work. So I'm grateful to report that, and I'm grateful to our staff.

One of the products that we do here and one of the things this board will contemplate later on this morning is the license-holder graduations and certificate issuance, which is one of the important responsibilities of this board.

For 2022, the State of New Mexico pushed out a total of 405 licensed police officers and 93 total Public Safety Telecommunicators.

Here at DPS, our Basic Police Officer Training Class 204 graduated 39 cadets from experts in internal affairs and ethics training in October. And then, most recently, November 17th and 18th, we brought in nationally recognized experts to instruct instructors in New Mexico Public Safety in deescalation techniques related to police use of force.

We're proud of these advanced trainings. We were grateful. The de-escalation training had over 80 students from all over the state who now possess the ability to train their constituency.

Also proud to announce, as it relates to state-mandated and regulated in-service and binding training requirements, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy is proud to host, December 12th through 14th, a free-of-charge -- all of these trainings have been free; they've been hosted by us -- a free-of-charge, in-service, facilitated training for accredited and required statutory hours to be in compliance with law enforcement training requirements.

There has been significant interest throughout the state already received by my office to attend this training. So that will go on 12 days from now -- 11 days from now.

We continue to make it our goal and our

priority to regularly host advanced training, to provide this training free of charge to our constituency whenever possible. And we currently are interested in connecting not only with the training cadre, but also the licensed professionals to communicate which trainings and train-the-trainer opportunities are most needed in their jurisdictions so that we can continue to deliver a statewide product that meets the goals.

Course accreditation: We continue to accredit for the purposes of training throughout the state. We have over 400 courses that we've accredited over the course of this calendar year. Fifty of those are specifically for in-service course accreditations so that agencies can either contract or conduct trainings and spread the curriculum.

Another significant and important data point for this board and this constituency to understand is the integration of our records, training, and data management system.

It's also an important time to recognize that we have a new employee who is working as a data analyst and Acadis administrator. She joined us at the end of October, and that employee has been But what I will tell you has been my observation, which is incredible, finding places where we have historically non-compliant requirements are now being filled up with compliance that happens earlier. I have several agencies that have achieved their required compliance requirements a month before the year is even up. The reporting deadline isn't until March 1st.

And so I'm really pleased at how not only the agencies have been willing to dedicate administrative folks to help them ingest the system, but their willingness to embrace this technological advance which will help us understand with much more precision where we are relative to our requirements and our goals.

In other matters, as we know, we are approaching a 60-day Legislative Session. We at the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy continue to collaborate in partnership with New Mexico community groups and organizations, many of which whose focus is on the modernization and professionalism of law enforcement as a profession.

We have collaborated with these groups and have hosted statewide stakeholder meetings with law enforcement professionals and community

instrumental in creating significant effectiveness to this very powerful data tool that we have.

I reported to you at the last meeting that agencies would be able to report their biennium, 2022-2023, and annual in-service statutory required training in realtime as the training was conducted. And I'm proud to report to you that I am now able to view as that training is coming in.

And one of the very important things that I've learned when analyzing this data and learning how it can be best viewed and utilized -- because it is significant, because we're talking about the breakdown of several disciplines over an 8,000-person constituency -- is it helps us identify where folks are relative to their deadlines, where agencies are having problems developing or implementing a particular course of instruction, and it helps us forecast where we can be assistive to them achieving compliance.

Agencies have been able to upload their rosters, pull rosters for things such as DFA requirements for disbursement for the Law Enforcement Protection Fund, view where their certifications stand, and a variety of other things that are very helpful for them as well.

organizations to identify legislative accomplishments that can be undertaken during this session.

We also have begun work with our constituency at the end of September and, again, later on in the month of December to help work on getting all input from the community and from the law enforcement and training constituency about how we shall integrate the new requirements associated with House Bill 68 and the new state laws that will come into effect in fiscal year '23.

Moving on to disciplinary matters, the closed session of the agenda today consists of 14 disciplining cases. The case catalog remains plenty busy. From September 2nd, the day after our last meeting in 2022, through today, December 1st, 2022, we have received 23 LEA-90s reporting law enforcement officer or telecommunicator misconduct allegations. We have 43 matters which are under current review or in the Notice of Investigation process.

Moving to our historical cases currently being prosecuted and investigated, we have 14 cases in the Notice of Contemplated Action process, five of which are awaiting NCA issuance by our

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administrative prosecutor partners at the Office of the Attorney General, six of which have NCAs which have been issued and served and are awaiting responses from the respondents.

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We have three NCAs prepared for referral to the Office of the Attorney General at this time.

We have six cases pending a formal hearing within their due process rights.

We have one case post-hearing pending a hearing officer's report deadline.

And since we last met, we have conducted ten oral responses with individual respondents and their legal counsel or representatives here at our office.

Within the last 30 days here at the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy, we have issued Notice of Immediate Suspension on two license-holders who have been charged with felony offenses.

We have four cases where an appeal has been filed with a court related to discipline rendered by this board against a respondent's license.

As I mentioned earlier, we have 14 cases pending adjudication, 14 of which is all the Board enforcement training. We are getting ready to undertake a generation change within the law and the way law enforcement training is conducted.

And I recognize some of the participants on our meeting today. And some of us have been at this for a very long time, and we have not seen changes like this during our careers, and I am excited at the opportunity. I look forward to the continued collaboration with our partners.

When seated at those hearings and when approached and directed by legislative committees, they're speaking to me. And my first instinct has been to reach outwardly to our constituency and to get the feedback of all of us.

So I'm grateful for your willingness to continue to participate in these collaborations and to participate in today's meeting. I will gladly stand for any questions. Madam Chair, members of the Board, thank you for your time.

SHERIFF SHANE FERRARI: Madam Chair, members of the Board, thank you. My name is Shane Ferrari. I'm the Sheriff of San Juan County.

This is something unique to our agency. I don't think we've ever had an opportunity to speak on behalf of one of our members of our agency facing a disciplinary matter.

Before you today is a case involving Robyn Roe, a deputy of ours, who was charged and self-admitted to driving while intoxicated in the State of Colorado.

The reason we're stepping forward and -- I am, and really want to step up for Deputy Roe is she

will have on its agenda today. In total to date, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy Board has a

total of 84 total active cases related to the disciplinary process.

Touching on in-service requirements -just a topic that I think is important -- as required by the law, I sent out on November 17th the in-service requirements and the biennium requirement notice to law enforcement leaders throughout New Mexico related to the 2022-2023 requirements. And I had reported earlier about the significant amount of success in compliance that we are already seeing in that.

Wrapping up the kind of statistical and analytical report, I'd just like to again welcome the new staff that we have brought on. We have brought on folks in the data analytics world. We have brought on folks in the misconduct world. We have brought on folks in the administrative and compliance world. And we have also brought on folks in the Law Enforcement Academy instructor roles.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve in this role. I am grateful for the opportunity to have been able to be participative in this very transformational time in New Mexico law

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is a phenomenal deputy. I have never had any disciplinary issues with her. She has been a stellar deputy for us and a role model.

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I cannot say that her actions are -- her actions are very disappointing to us. However, we feel that she is an outstanding deputy and needs to be given a second chance.

You'll find that I did send the Board a letter explaining our stance on -- on Ms. Roe's disciplinary action and our request to have a reduction in her certification suspension.

Again, I feel that this case is unique. Deputy Roe has been an outstanding member of this agency. She is community-minded. She assists in all areas of our community events that happen here voluntarily.

This, again, is something that's unique, and we wanted to step forward and just let you know that our -- our fear is with any type of max suspension on this, we may lose her as an officer in a time when it's hard to find law enforcement officers, especially female officers.

But, again, Deputy Roe has proven herself time and time again, and this negative action that you see before her is not reflective of who she is

take Ms. Roe's history of loyalty, dedication, and work ethic into consideration and the punishment that has been issued into consideration.

My request is for Ms. Roe to receive a reduced certification suspension and have her return to our agency as soon as you feel necessary.

We take DWI very seriously in New Mexico and in San Juan County. I have fired deputies for far less than what Mrs. Roe is facing here today, again. But I feel that she is an outstanding officer and a real credit to our agency and the citizens of San Juan County.

Thank you.

VICE CHAIR GREEN: Thank you, Sheriff Ferrari.

MR. CHRIS MECHELS: Yes. Good morning, members of the Board. I'm Chris Mechels. I've commented in the past. I've been addressing the Board since about 2013 following up on the Jeanette Anaya killing.

First, let me say I think the Sheriff just abused the public input. This is not intended for the Sheriff to come and make a case for one of his deputies during public input. I think you should

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as a person nor how she has served the people of San Juan County or the San Juan County Sheriff's Office.

So as we know as police leaders, we know discipline is an action to correct behavior. This level of action can be different for a lot of different people. Beyond correcting behavior, it can also turn into a punishment.

The courts have already issued their punishment. Furthermore, Ms. Roe has also been punished through work demotion, loss of pay status and PERA contributions and more. I believe that the discipline so far has been enough to correct the behavior.

As I said, good police officers are hard to find, especially good female officers, but she may not return to law enforcement if not given an opportunity or have the ability to support herself.

She's taking a role in my agency right now as a records technician, cutting her pay in more than half with the hopes of returning to law enforcement.

I have no doubt, if given the opportunity, that Ms. Roe will recover and use this experience to help others, and I would humbly request that you

have cut him off. He's got his own opportunities through channels, and he's abusing the Board.

The two things I would like to raise where the Board has been remiss continues to be, following the departure of the previous director, the Board has dropped any -- any effort of redoing your curriculum.

The previous -- Kelly, the previous director, was trying to get the support of the Board for over a year to go back to a formal curriculum development process through IADLEST and got no support or funding from the Board on this.

So what you're doing, which is of great concern to the public, is you're essentially running a 2013 curriculum which was established illegally.

The impact of this is great. The basic curriculum we run here in Santa Fe County is 677 hours.

Las Cruces, our sister city, runs a curriculum of 1,089.

I mean, that's a ridiculous disparity. We need to get a new curriculum established under national standards in place. And right now, it seems it's dropped off your agenda.

The second thing I would raise, which is a

long-standing issue which I've raised to the Board
and you have never addressed, your Certificate by
Waiver program. You're overusing the Certificate by
Waiver program. And if you're going to continue to
do that, the Board should responsibly look at what
you're doing there.

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I have done some IPRAs. And when I look at the documentation, even, for the IPRA candidates, it's very poor documentation, even to the point of being incomplete. It shouldn't even be acceptable under input.

And the other thing you're doing is the way you're certifying these people is you're teaching the test. So what you're doing is you are running a bunch of very unqualified people through the Certificate by Waiver program, which you have begun overusing.

You are endangering people with that process. The Board needs to sit down, take it seriously. Go with the Director, look at what he's doing. Don't take his word for it. Look at what he's doing. What you're going to find there is a troubled mess.

Anyway, State boards have been -- these problems have been of very long standing. They go 1 respectfully present to you, starting with
