I'd like to go to item number 5, our director's report, Interim Ben Baker. I do want to compliment -- I don't know how many people got the opportunity to attend, recently, the law enforcement memorial services at DPS the other day, but I did

want to commend the DPS staff, the leadership and

incredibly professional and dedicated staff here at the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy, as well as the Department of Public Safety. I would like to recognize a new member to our team that will be new to folks from the last board meeting, and that is Alexis Salazar, who has joined me at the table to my right. Alexis has been graciously assisting me with all matters discipline-related to my role, as well as preparation for this Board meeting. So thank you, Alexis, for your participation.

Welcome to our members of the public. Welcome to members of the Governor's staff, law enforcement who is here; we appreciate your attendance, and members of the media and the public, as I mentioned, as well as some our academy leaders from some of our satellites. Thank you for being here.

We serve 5,600-plus New Mexico certified peace officers, and 2,500-plus telecommunicators who serve approximately 180 agencies statewide.

By way of summary, I respectfully present the following information, highlighting the activities of the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy that have taken place since we last met.

The first thing I would like to talk about

is the law enforcement academy director vacancy, which we expressed last time. That vacancy has been posted publicly and we have received robust interest nationally. At present, we're conducting resume reviews and trying to distal that candidate pool down to a workable number. And it would not be outside of the realm of possibility if this Board was presented for a recommendation at its September meeting. That is my sincere hope.

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Next, license holder graduations, which the Attorney General mentioned, which is a really important part of not only why we're here today, but why we're gathered here under the statute.

The New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy Basic Training calendar year 2022, year to date, has graduated 214 officers, including all of our partners and satellite academies and certification by waiver program.

Here at DPS, we were very blessed to have academy class 203, that class graduated 33 cadets from 20 agencies. Some of those leaders are here today. That graduation day was May the 18th, and we're very proud of those folks. Those certifications will appear on your agenda today.

Private safety telecommunicators graduated

with this Board, with Presbyterian Health Services and they have offered to provide to this academy instruction specific to psychological services to be offered to the community via law enforcement practitioners, as well as accrediting the use of force instruction, and beginning the process of school resource officer training, which is required by New Mexico State Statute 29-7-14. Those things are currently being implemented.

It is also of note, and for this Board's consumption that since January of '22 this agency has accredited a total of 288 courses. 37 of those are specifically in-service course accreditations, which agencies and contract vendors alike can utilize to train police officers and telecommunicators statewide.

In addition, we have received hundreds of instructor certification applications designed to replenish the ranks and teach accredited curriculum statewide.

On the records, training and data management system, as I reported to you at the last meeting at in April, the Acadis Readiness Suite phase-in continues to make significant progress. I'll give you an update on the progress today.

17 out of class 155 in the adjacent room to us, last week, on Friday, so that is very fresh for us.

Statewide, year to date, Public Safety Telecommunicators graduates 62 telecommunicators, including all satellite academies.

So 214 and 62 year to date.

By way of advanced training update for the Board's edification, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy will be offering at least three advanced training classes during duration of this summer, including Institute for Law Enforcement Standards, Internal Affairs, professional standards and Fair and Impartial Policing.

Procurement is underway for those classes, and accreditation from the State Of New Mexico has already been completed.

It is the goal of the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy to return to regularly hosting advanced training provided free to our constituents whenever possible.

Efforts are currently underway to identify which trainings and which train the trainer opportunities exist and are needed by our constituents statewide.

We have recently met, since we met last

There are over 340 approved agency-training portal users. The reason why this is significant, and the significant movement that has been made since the last Board meeting is at present those approved Acadis data entry folks from our agencies -- from our constituency can now enter in mandatory 2202 and 2023 in-service annual and biannual accredited course rosters directly into the system.

The number of users, the number of people who have received the training and the number of availability of that data, literally increases daily.

As I mentioned at the last meeting, we have conducted webinar rollouts of this, starting in January of this calendar year, for the purposes of training users on the law enforcement side and the telecommunicator side, so they can better service their agencies and provide the most accurate and up-to-date information to the regulator and to the public.

Other matters the Attorney General mentioned, so I won't spend a lot of time on it. May 19th we had our Fallen Officer Memorial. Some of you were in attendance. It honors the police officers who have died in the line of duty. We added three names to our wall outside, which if you haven't had a chance to look at it, I encourage you to take a

look at it during your time visiting with us here today at it. Members of my staff were responsible for the coordination and delivery, and I agree with what was said earlier. I'm very proud of their efforts. They did a good job honoring the families of the police officers who died in the line of duty.

On to disciplinary matters. By way of summary for the consumption of the Board, the agenda consists of five cases. A snapshot of the current case catalog is as follow: April 14th, which is the date of our last meeting, through June 1st, yesterday, 2022, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy has received 17 LEA 90s reporting allegations of police officer or telecommunicator misconduct. 20 current cases are under review, or in the notice of investigation process.

Historical cases currently being prosecuted, 16 cases in the Notice of Contemplated Action process, seven of which are awaiting issuance by the Office of the Attorney General, our administrative prosecutor. Nine of which have been issued and served, and are awaiting response from respondents to answer them. We have four oral responses scheduled with respondents and counsel which are imminent, meaning tomorrow. We have five

Increased communication with the administrative prosecutor, increased availability and efficiency are contributing to our success in that category, is our belief.

Here at the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy, and at the satellite academies, not only represented here today, but statewide, we train police officers and dispatchers. That is our job. The goal is to make them smarter, safer, more responsive and to give better service to their community.

Every day when I return here, I'm reminded of that fact -- when I attend things like our graduations and our memorial ceremonies and meetings such as this, it reminds me to rededicate myself to the notion, that is why we're here and that is who we serve, the future of our law enforcement and our public safety. It is an honor to be here to report to you. I continue to look forward, during the time that I have in this role, and going forward in my leadership role, to serve this board and to learn the best ways to support and guide New Mexico Law Enforcement training.

I will gladly stand for any questions. CHAIRMAN BALDARAS: Thank you.

Director Baker, I would like to say first and foremost, I would like to say welcome. I know at the last meeting I could hear your voice, but it is good to see you again.

And I would like to thank you and your staff. You mentioned you are at day 69, I've seen a lot of buzz going on down here, and that's always a good thing, so I would like to thank you and your staff jumping right in, picking it up and going with it.

Secondly, Mr. Chair, I would like to thank the staff and Mr. Baker down here, of course, for the Fallen Officers' Memorial. When I used to serve as the president of our association, it was always the biggest honor to be -- you don't really want to say you were happy to be here, but it was an honor to be here in May to present a wreath. So while I still do it at home, it is always our president's duty to do it, and so it is always a wonderful thing. So thank

cases pending formal hearing, and we have 13 cases where formal hearings have been conducted and are pending a Hearing Officer's report.

Also of note, and I think for the Board's awareness, in the last 30 days this agency has issued immediate suspension against three New Mexico license holders charged with felony crimes.

There are five cases pending adjudication today, as I mentioned earlier, and to date, and I think this is important by way of comparing and contrast, 59 total active cases exist within the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy Board, disciplinary case catalog, comparing that to the number of 78 which existed at the last meeting.

I think it is no surprise that those of you met me, or were in attendance at the last meeting, that my interim role, and I've been for a relatively short period of time. Today marks the 69 day that I've occupied this role. I'm grateful to work closely with not only our staff, but the teamwork and professionals, the administrative lawyer and administrative prosecutor and their staff. The discipline cases are in not only a manageable volume, but I think in a volume that has not been seen here in quite some time.

you for that.

And I would also like to thank -- I was just thinking about it, looking at Exhibit A, we have all of these names of people from New Mexico that are standing up and volunteering and taking on the duty of a law enforcement officer.

And so if you get the opportunity, will you please thank them for doing this duty. I know it has become hard over the years. I know we've seen a lot of changes, both from the courts and the legislators, and just the community in general. Please let them know a thank you and that it is appreciated that they stand up to do this duty.

And then I did have one question that was brought to my attention approximately a month ago, a couple of weeks ago, that we may have issues with the LEA-84s being filed, either by individuals or agencies, which is sort of required.

And wondered if you could sort of give me an idea of what's going on with LEA-84s or the agencies who are filing them or not filing them, or individuals that have to file or not file, just sort of give me sort of an update on what's going on there.

MR. BAKER: Certainly. Mr. Chair, DA

verifying and certifying that the minimum number of hours required within state statute have been trained and accomplished by their individual police officers employed at their agency.

So this form is filled out by the agency head and submitted to the Law Enforcement Academy director to certify those facts. Delineated within are the statutory requirements, which are changing and variable, based on legislative movement, but at present we're talking about safe pursuit, hate crimes, so on and so forth. There is a box to be checked, and an affirmation to be made relative to the employees who are certified professionally within their agency, or an agency, and their compliance with these requirements.

The same form exists for handgun qualification shoots, that is what is referred to as an LEA-83, and folks who are practitioners in this room are very familiar with these. Those are also requirements.

These are dealt with on pretty -- well, not pretty, very specific deadlines related to the New Mexico State Statute, and the dates of importance to think about the reporting period that just closed are December 31st of 2021, was the deadline to complete

Tedrow, thank you for the question.

This has been the source of many inquiries and I've pulled a significant amount of data. I'll try to encapsulate it in a way that is meaningful for the Board and the public's consumption. I think the best way for me to do that is to explain kind of the numbers that you were talking about, the forms, and what their purpose is.

So when Board Member Tedrow was talking about LEA-84s and 82s, what we're talking about is affidavits confirming and certifying mandatory compliance with the State's laws associated with biannual training and firearms. So there are things that are required of our telecommunicators and our police officers to be conducted, because these run in cycles. And I mention that, because the cycle that most recently came to a close, the reporting deadline of March 1st, is the calendar years '20 and '21, biannual training cycle. So the form that you're talking about, which I have a copy of that I could reference, particularly drawing attention to what is referred to as the LEA-84. It is the agency in-service training report for a law enforcement officer.

This is filled out by an agency head,

the training -- the preceding two-year time period. The deadline to report compliance with that training was March 1st, 2022.

In order to alleviate any confusion, despite this being in the statute, this office sends out, in this case in November of 2021, not only a reminder of the statutory obligations to law enforcement leaders, but more importantly, the how-to piece associated with what forms need to be filled out and why, with specificity lent towards the deadlines and the reporting requirements.

The final paragraph of the letter sent out to law enforcement leaders in November of 2021, so trying to be well in advance of the December 31st training deadline, and then particularly in front of the March 1st reporting deadline.

Final paragraph, annual in-service training for '20 and 2021 biannual in-service training, shall be completed no later than December 31st, 2021. Reporting is due no later than March 1st, 2022. The Board requests updates regarding annual and biannual in-service training, compliance at their regularly-scheduled board meetings, which is what you're raising today.

So that notification went to law

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enforcement leaders in November of 2021. What I have are categorization of the data compiled relative to the compliance deadline that passed March 1st. And they are distinctly related into a couple of different categories, and I think that is the best way to view them, because as I mentioned, and that's why I went through what probably seems like an extraneous explanation, the difference between an 83 and 84 is they are distinctive and separate, but both equally required for full compliance. It is possible, and I will demonstrate here in a minute, to have done one or another, but not both. That, obviously, would communicated.

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MR. TEDROW: If I may, for clarification, on the 84 it is just an affidavit of what is statutorily required. So if an officer were to take some other continuing education or training classes, those don't necessarily get reported on this; is that right? This is just what the statutes are requiring?

MR. BAKER: Right. This, specifically, and it delineates on the face of the form, the statutory required subcategories of required training.

MR. TEDROW: Okay.

MR. BAKER: There is a whole robust category of external advanced training that folks do. deadline required.

So we talked about the deadlines. That is a category of folks. Another category of folks, those agencies who submitted an affidavit certifying partial compliance. What I mean by that is there are agencies who submitted either an 84 or an 83, but not both. And then there are agencies who did not submit an affidavit certifying compliance in either category by the deadline. Those categories are what I see as existing. That categorization does not take into account instances where the training was conducted and not reported. That is simply data that we would not be aware of.

The data compilation from the reporting deadline which passed in March of 2022 is follows: Agencies who reported an 83 and 84, so that first category, indicating their attestation to their full compliance, the number is 59 agencies.

Again, we're talking about the approximate number of 180 law enforcement agencies.

Agencies who reported only an LEA-83, which is only the firearms, three.

Agencies who reported only an LEA-84, so that is all of the mandatory in-service required training, 30.

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We compile that, as well, and keep that information and report it, as well, but this --

MR. TEDROW: Simply the statutory reporting?

MR. BAKER: Yes, sir, that is correct.

The three categories that I would basically separate these into are those agencies -- this is an agency form. Again, the purpose of the explanation was to make clear to folks who might not understand how this comes in.

The individual license belongs to the practitioner. The reporting form is the agency who employs them, because we're talking about certified for licensure, commissioned, agency-salaried employees. Those three things must exist to be in the pool that we're talking about. It is not identical to other licensed professions that exist within New Mexico, where one can be a solo practitioner, or one can be a freelanced practitioner of whatever field they may be licensed in. So I think that distinction is important, and sometimes is overlooked.

So subcategories, those agencies who have submitted an affidavit certifying compliance with all mandated requirements of in-service training by the

Agencies who did not report either form by the mandatory deadline of March 1st, 96.

Not ignoring the licensed professionals also governed by this Board, the public safety telecommunicator agencies who reported, they do not have firearms requirement, so there's no LEA-83 for those folks, that number did report full compliance, is 24.

And the agencies who did not report, according to our records and the deadline imposed by the statute, is 31.

So I mentioned the statute a couple of times, I'll tell you guys what it is, and a couple thoughts that will hopefully answer the district attorney's question more thoroughly. 29-7-7.1 in-service training requirements. This statute includes a penalty that can be afforded via this Board for noncompliance on the license holder. There's no mechanism to hold to account the certification of the agency to which they are employed.

There is no mechanism within the statute to accommodate for late submissions that were, in fact, conducted within the deadline. So if you achieved the December 31st training deadline, but you failed

to report, we'll still accept the training here at the LEA. We will update the file, absolutely. But you are in technical noncompliance with the statute, as it was written.

I think --

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MR. TEDROW: Director, and I'm sorry, I wanted to pull up 29-7-7.1, but I'm currently charging right now.

Does the statute actually call for the affidavit itself?

MR. BAKER: Yes, sir.

MR. TEDROW: Does the law enforcement academy have the ability to report and record all certified officers trainings that they do?

MR. BAKER: I'm not sure I understand the question.

MR. TEDROW: I guess -- okay, let me break it down. In my position, as an attorney, I have to do CLEs every year, continuing legal education every year, and then I file them with the State Bar. It sits in the State Bar, and it shows what I had, and it shows that I have the credits for the year and that I'm in compliance.

Can an officer or an agency log into some sort of system and submit -- let's just say they did 1 enforcement training requirements to the director no

2 later than March 1st of the year in which the

3 requirements must be met. The director shall provide

4 annual notice to all certified police officers 5 regarding in-service law enforcement training

6 requirements. Failure to complete in-service law

7 enforcement training requirements may be grounds for

8 suspension of a certified police officer's

9 certification. The officer's certification may be 10 reinstated by the Board when the police officer 11 presents the Board with evidence satisfying the 12 in-service law enforcement training requirements.

> And so I think, to kind of round out what I think the training -- or what I understand your question to be is, this is not the same as using the example you used, the attorney servicing his or her license relative to the bar or whatever the regulatory entity. It is different presently than the New Mexico law contemplates for a certified police officer, for a couple of those employment-specific reasons that I mentioned earlier.

And so one of the things that is really important, for my perspective, is to make sure that it is super clear that there is no attachment in the statute relative -- what you didn't hear is where the

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employer fits in relative to that. What you heard are all of the incumbencies on the licensee reporting. I'm a layperson related to the law but that is my reading of the statute as it exists. MR. TEDROW: Director Baker, and I'm sorry,

MR. BAKER: Acadis is the platform. MR. TEDROW: It sounds like and, I'll just ask it, because I think it may be a recommendation for the new formation of two different boards that we're going to see come out of -- I hear off the last legislation. With the Acadis system, is there a need for the 84 and the 83?

what do you call the system now where people file --

MR. BAKER: I think the notion of an agency reporting in a holistic way, it's compliance -- and, again, we're talking about New Mexico, we have a robust group of law enforcement agencies. Our largest agency, employing 1,000 people or so, and we have agencies that have one or two certified law enforcement officers. This encapsulates the entirety of the department's compliance with what is supposed to be a voluntary compliance based system.

So I think until a suitable alternative is suggested, perhaps by this Board or perhaps even in legislation, I think this is the reliant piece that

a training yesterday on hate crimes. Can they submit it over to you the next day, and it goes into their

record?

MR. BAKER: That's an excellent question and something that is of relatively recent development, going back to my compliance presentation about our Acadis capability.

So, six months ago, no. Today that is become being more and more commonplace, the agency's ability to be able to upload in real time certified training that was accredited and conducted through the Acadis portal. And the reason why this is so important, from my perspective, and my examination of learning, not only about this job, but about the rules that deal with this profession, there is no more discussion about whether it gets lost in the mail, how it arrives here, because that's not contemplated in the statute.

And I think it will be helpful if I give you a little excerpt from it. All certified police officers who are eligible for in-service training shall, during each 24-month period of employment, complete a minimum of 40 hours in-service courses approved by the Board. All certified police officers shall provide proof of completing in-service law

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we have existed with. But I certainly am open to any discussion or suggestion.

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MR. TEDROW: Director Baker, I just -- in reviewing stuff, and now with the new system and stuff, I almost wonder if when we have the creation of the new Board if we shouldn't look at whether there is either a need or necessity -- I think it's a best practice. If I had to put a best practice, and I'm running an agency, I want to make sure all of my people are certified and ready to roll. But I almost wonder if it's a necessity. So maybe it's something down the road that the Board or the academy to look at, is -- I would almost say, Is it a necessity, first?

And then my second question on this -- you said the reporting date was 3/1 of '22. And it's for the years 2020 and '21. Because of COVID, because of the shutdowns that we saw, was there a problem with officers getting their certifications or their trainings, that you noticed?

MR. BAKER: The certification -- thank you for the question, Mr. Chair, DA Tedrow, the training was somewhat complicated, because it was done through the mechanisms that this board will approve licensure on. So I would be -- it would be ridiculous for me

there certainly had to have been an effect.

MR. TEDROW: Do you know, did people have to leave the state to get their trainings, or to get their updates or anything?

MR. BAKER: Mr. Chair, DA Tedrow, I do not know.

MR. TEDROW: My last question for you would be, I know this board, somewhere during the pandemic, we addressed the one-year rule that people have to be -- remember when we did that? You got one year for being hired, to get through the academy I know we addressed that. Did we fail to address continuing

MR. BAKER: Mr. Chair, DA Tedrow, I would hesitate to say we failed to address continuing education. It's simply matter, and hopefully I did a reasonable job of explaining, it is a matter of statute and administrative code.

That does not have any flexibility inlaid within the law, so I don't believe so.

MR. TEDROW: Okay. Director, thank you. Thank you for addressing this. Like I said, when it was brought to my attention, it made me go read some more stuff, and I had some questions, and I thank you.

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to say, particularly, from the seat that I occupied at that point in time, that there was no impact on the ability to ingress police officers to this profession during a pandemic. I'm certain that did have an impact, because that is what makes a person certified, either academy, or certification by waiver of previous training. Those both happened in settings like this. Those both happened in this room, for example. So I think I would be foolish to say that that had no impact. I'm certain that it did. We struggled in our own ways here, during my direct kind of observation of what to do when running a police academy during a pandemic. How do you mitigate the spread of viruses? How do you manage folks who are going to be out for periods of time? So it did have a significant impact on that.

In terms of how agencies conduct their training requirements and incumbency under the statute is something that does not necessarily happen at this centralized location.

So I think the best folks to answer those questions are the leaders of the agencies, and what they did to mitigate those same problems and challenges that we encountered here, in the kind of base training certification environment. I believe

And that's all I have.

MR. WILLIAMS: Director Baker, Hence Williams, if it falls back on the individual, the officer to take the course, is there any way the individual can -- I think you said there was 99 -- I don't remember the exact number of individuals or agencies that had not reported in time. But it falls back on the individual officer with regard to their certification.

Is there any way, or is it even possible for that individual, whether they send the form in directly to this agency -- I know you have another way of reporting now that is going to be a lot faster, but is there any way they can self-report so they don't lose that certification, if the agency isn't sending it in?

MR. BAKER: Certainly. Mr. Chair, Officer Williams, thank you for the question. I think it's a very good one. This office -- we have some folks with credible amounts of longevity in this office, so I have a really good, even though it's not interpersonal -- a really good understanding of how things historically worked here from folks who know much better than I, we'll accept any training that you send to us. You're a New Mexico licensed police

officer/telecommunicator and you send us a form indicating you have completed training, whether it is early, whether it is late, whether it is not typed, those things are not contemplated by this office. We will ingress that and populate it in the file -- obviously, accredited coursework that meets all the various criteria, so there is nothing that is prohibitive of a license holder from doing what you're describing.

I think where we run into a problem, and the form, and it's robust, but there is an attestation at the bottom that the agency head who fills this out, understands that failure to submit this by the March 1st deadline, reporting these results, may result in the suspension of a law enforcement officers certification for your employees.

So if you think about a traditional police department, the name of the person filling this out and the certification is also inlaid within the reporting. So while the question is a good one, and I think there's no prohibition -- there certainly is no prohibition within the statute that says you cannot submit training. And I will tell you practically, not only from my observation, but from

and that's the reading of the statute.

So, hopefully, that answers the question. MR. WILLIAMS: You did, thank you.

MR. MENDOZA: Mr. Chair, if I could weigh in on this issue. I appreciate all of the questions. I know this has been an issue, and sitting on the Board for the last three years, it is something that we realize there is a gap between agencies that are reporting and not reporting, and how that's being tracked. And I think one of the inherent issues is the statute requires the agency to report, but there is no accountability to the agency if they don't. The accountability lies within the individual officer.

So I think in a perfect world, what would happen is, is if the reporting -- because the license is tied to the individual, if the reporting and the training isn't done, then our system would flag that individual, send them a letter of noncompliance, and tell them they are not in compliance. The Board would be made aware of that and we would move forward with whatever necessary action we have to take. Or there has to be something built in the statute that the agency would be held accountable in some form or fashion.

folks, we will accept those. We have accepted a number of compliance documents and training attestations that came after the March 1st deadline. What I'm trying to demonstrate to this group, and I think hopefully successfully, is that there simply is not laid in any flexibility to do anything about that.

One thing that I should mention, there is no rehabilitation of a failure to be in compliance in the reading of the statute. When you have reached March 1st and failed to report, regardless of whether it's an individual person or the agency reporting on behalf of that person, there is no rehab to go back rearward in time and become compliant. We will absolutely take the training and populate the file to be reflective of the reality of the situation, because that's a fact. There are people who have replied late, for example, agencies, that did, in fact, training and did conduct it within the prescribed time period. They simply reported late. That is a category of folks that exists here to. The statute doesn't afford for an apportionment. And I think the DA did a good job of encapsulating it, you are now no more in compliance then you were on March 2nd. You are technically out of compliance,

This might not be a popular belief, but you know we do, with the LEPF, the Law Enforcement Protection Fund, we do hold money for certified officers. If they are not in compliance, maybe we need to tie that appropriation of money to actual certified and trained officers. Maybe that will get the departments to report as required.

There is a gap here, and I think they need to strengthen the statute, and clarify the statute for accountability, and to make sure that there's -- that law enforcement agencies -- I know they're trying to do the right thing. There's a -- it's a lot to track training and reporting, and especially for the law enforcement academy to track all of this information.

I think we're going in the right direction with Acadis, and I'm hoping that now that this is up and running, that it will be a lot easier to determine who's not in compliance, and what we can do about that.

But I want to weigh in on that. It's an issue. It's been an issue for years. And although with all of the work we're taking a step in the right direction, I don't think it's enough.

And, as a Board sitting on here for the

last few years, I'm not sure we've actually made a recommendation to any of the rules, on how we can change some of these. And I think I'm willing to work on that, and I know this board will, too, because as law enforcement agencies and law enforcement officers, we want accountability. We want the proper training.

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CHAIRMAN BALDARAS: Director Baker, I appreciate that feedback.

MR. SMITH: Greetings, Board. It's nice to finally see you all in person, instead of reading about you.

And, Director Baker, thank you for putting us on the agenda.

I'm very pleased to be here in your first in-person meeting after COVID.

A little bit about myself, just so you don't think I have a speech impediment. I have 25 years back East in law enforcement, and I have almost 11 here in New Mexico; 12 years as a police chief, 9 here in Roswell. I'm an adjunct undergraduate. I'm also a subject matter expert in transformational

The academy must undergo an accreditation process. You're going to look at Law Enforcement Academy training staff and our budget, which is all submitted in that comprehensive application.

You would be looking at our facilities, the instructors, program management, and the curriculum that has to meet or exceed the standards and expectations established by this board and the director. This application document that I did submit will be shared with law enforcement communities regarding the City of Roswell's interest in recreating a regional satellite academy.

We sent out informational letters to surrounding areas that may be interested in participating if we were allowed to have our satellite academy.

Stakeholders, I have them posted on this -- I'll get to the stakeholders later, but there is a lot of interest in having the academy.

This should be of interest to you that Roswell is in the final stages, we have about a year left, of the national accreditation process. So we're going to maintain standards, and we're going to maintain top standards, and that will include the academy.

leadership and organizational leadership.

What I'm here to talk about today, though, is to reestablish the Roswell police academy, satellite academy.

In my humble opinion, there isn't a logical reason why we can't reinitiate that academy. About a year and three months ago, I submitted an application that is 21 pages long. I don't know if you got copies of it. I know somebody did, because they sent me a message and said, We want more data.

I feel we can adequately accommodate an academy like that. I think we have the training and personnel. I think we have the qualifications, and I'm here to humbly ask the Board to consider it, to allow us to train our own recruits in the southeastern part of the state, not in Hobbs and not in Santa Fe. We want one in Roswell.

A little background, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy in front of me, determines the maximum number of satellite academies which may be certified at any time. In making its determination, the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy weighs the impact on other academies, which in this case would be Santa Fe and Hobbs. Those are the related academies close to us.

Another note is this was 10 to zero by my City Council that they want this academy. Some of the interest in this did happen because of COVID. We brought interest to the Board and people in my area that we would like to have control, and that's a good word for it, control in management and oversight of our recruits.

Another point of interest is that we have -- one of our stakeholders is Eastern New Mexico University in Roswell. They have offered facilities, and not only the facilities, but they also are going to tie the academy credits into the potential for going to two-year or four-year degree program. This is an opportunity we can't just look past or fluff off.

So if you look at the -- I wanted to do a PowerPoint, but you can thank Brian that we're not going to do a twist, and so we printed this off so it will help expedite it.

Again, background and history, in the '80s Roswell had a police academy -- satellite academy. I'm not sure why it was discontinued.

We currently do have the fire academy there -- the Roswell Fire Academy, so it's not a foreign entity. It hasn't been totally dismissed.

involved.

The City of Roswell complies with all the requirements recognized by the New Mexico Administrative Code, the NMAC, in establishment of a regional satellite academy.

One -- some of the main reasons why I'm seeking this, recruits here in Roswell and the surrounding area will have access to a certified police academy and reducing travel time one way of up to three and half hours, and if you are going south, it's two hours.

Training will be more specific to the southeastern part of the state. And what I mean by that, we're not going to go rogue. Of course, we'll follow the accredited curriculum that's provided here, but it would be awful nice to have access to our recruits in Roswell and have nearby as they go through the academy. It makes perfect sense.

Also, the oversight -- I don't know if any of you are familiar with this. There is not a lot of gray area in the way we handle our personnel matters in Roswell. You fly right, and there's not any latitude as well. We would like to have that reference to our recruits from the start. We don't want to give them a break to fly up to Santa Fe or Hobbs.

was a year that this was designed, but our payment program goes up 2 percent, and it has a cost of living increase, so it's pretty close. Those are the rough numbers, and we're prepared for this. We have everything. We have the facilities. We have the resources. We have the personnel. And we have the commitment from the stakeholders. So you'll see the financial consideration, operating budget, that's

your salaries -- full-time salaries with two people

It's a year behind, I'll tell you that, because it

We definitely feel that we -- Roswell alone, could supply the 10 people per academy class. We need 20 per year to justify it, but we have the surrounding communities, Chaves County, Eddy County, Lea County, Lincoln County, and all of the agencies within. I don't think we'll have any problem housing that.

The other thing I would like to do is run our academies off cycle, the ones being run, the January side and July side, I would like to run ours in the off cycle. I think it would be beneficial for the whole state. How many times do you have somebody who pulls an ankle or something in the third week, and he has to wait all of the way around again? They

It is a cost savings, wear and tear on vehicles; again, we like the oversight. RPD possesses all the in-house qualified training staff and the facilities.

We supply this academy a lot of certified trainers. It doesn't make any sense, when we have them right there in Roswell. We still would assist this academy, because it's our state academy, but it doesn't make any sense to fly our guys north when we could do it in-house.

The proposed regional academy will be implemented under existing organizational authority. We have everything in place already. This is not going to tax the Roswell Police Department. We already have an addition lieutenant, salaried. We have the clerical person, and it will be part of our organizational chart and part of our program down there. We're already proposed for it. We don't have to go for budgeting or anything. We are all lined up for this. Like I said, a year ago we had the counsel vote on it. I did a memoranda, agenda, and we went through it. Again, it was 10-0. They're still asking about it, what the progress is.

You'll see in this PowerPoint recreation financial consideration outlined for five years.

may have access to our academy.

Stakeholders and partners, I have a list there, I don't know if you want me to read them off, but Mystic produces has driving range, as well as a flexy forty minutes down the road, the City of Roswell, Eastern New Mexico University, the New Mexico Military Institute, New Mexico Medical Center, Roswell Independent School District, Roswell Air Center, and, of course, the community, I rattled that off.

Because of the qualifications of the Roswell Police Department staff, and our access to facilities, and our stakeholder support, I find there isn't a logical reason to send recruits to Hobbs and Santa Fe, if we can have a satellite academy here in Roswell.

I'll take any questions. I've been waiting patiently for this. I'm motivated.
