TEDROW: Mr. Chair, so moved.</p> <p>3 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: I have a motion for</p> <p>4 approval. A second?</p> <p>5 CHIEF MIRABAL: Chief Mirabal, I'll</p> <p>6 second.</p> <p>7 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: It has been moved and</p> <p>8 seconded to approve. Any discussion on the agenda?</p> <p>9 Seeing none, we'll call the roll. Is</p> <p>10 there any objection to the approval of today's</p> <p>11 agenda? Seeing none. The agenda's approved.</p> <p>12 All in favor of the motion to approve --</p> <p>13 all in favor of the motion to approve the agenda say</p> <p>14 aye. Any opposed?</p> <p>15 The motion carries unanimously, and the</p> <p>16 agenda is approved.</p> <p>17 The next item is approval of the minutes</p> <p>18 from the board's April meeting. Those minutes were</p> <p>19 posted on the board's website. Are there any</p> <p>20 questions or edits to the draft minutes? Seeing --</p> <p>21 MR. TEDROW: Mr. Chair, having reviewed</p> <p>22 the minutes, I move to approve.</p> <p>23 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Is there a second?</p> <p>24 OFFICER WILLIAMS: Hence Williams. I'll</p> <p>25 second.</p>

It is June 14th, 2023, 9:00 a.m.,</p> <p>3 and I hereby call to order the meeting and, I</p> <p>4 believe, the last meeting of the current New Mexico</p> <p>5 Law Enforcement Academy Board.</p> <p>6 Laura, may we please have a roll call?</p> <p>7 MS. ESCARCIDA: The Honorable Raul Torrez?</p> <p>8 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Present.</p> <p>9 MS. ESCARCIDA: District attorney Rick</p> <p>10 Tedrow?</p> <p>11 MR. TEDROW: Present.</p> <p>12 MS. ESCARCIDA: Chief Tim Johnson?</p> <p>13 CHIEF JOHNSON: Present.</p> <p>14 MS. ESCARCIDA: Sheriff Adan Mendoza?</p> <p>15 Chief Summer Mirabal?</p> <p>16 CHIEF MIRABAL: Present.</p> <p>17 MS. ESCARCIDA: Officer Hence Williams</p> <p>18 III?</p> <p>19 OFFICER WILLIAMS: Present.</p> <p>20 MS. ESCARCIDA: Mr. Benny Roybal?</p> <p>21 Dr. Bobbie Jean Green?</p> <p>22 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Thank you. I believe</p> <p>23 we have a quorum.</p> <p>24 The first item on our agenda today is</p> <p>25 actually the approval of the agenda, and I will</p>	5	<p>1 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: It has been moved and</p> <p>2 seconded to approve. Is there any discussion?</p> <p>3 Seeing none, all in favor of the motion to</p> <p>4 approve the minutes, say aye. Any opposed?</p> <p>5 Seeing none, motion carries unanimously.</p> <p>6 The minutes are approved.</p> <p>7 Chair's report. Sadly, the only thing I</p> <p>8 have to report is this is my second and last</p> <p>9 opportunity to chair this board, and I look forward</p> <p>10 to seeing how the new framework evolves over time.</p> <p>11 I know there's going to be a lot of interest in</p> <p>12 that, and I think the work that's been done,</p> <p>13 specifically by Director Baker and others, is really</p> <p>14 commendable, he has done a lot. The staff here has</p> <p>15 done a lot to really restore the public confidence</p> <p>16 in the board.</p> <p>17 I look forward to seeing that progress</p> <p>18 continue in the next iteration of this framework.</p> <p>19 With that, I would also invite counsel to</p> <p>20 make a couple of introductions, I think, of some of</p> <p>21 the administrative prosecutors that are here present</p> <p>22 today.</p> <p>23 MR. DWORAK: Chairman, members of the</p> <p>24 board. Thank you. I just wanted to take a moment</p> <p>25 to introduce two of the administrative prosecutors</p>

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1 in our office who work with this board. There are
 2 two additional prosecutors that actually are in a
 3 status conference meeting that couldn't make it
 4 today, but I wanted to introduce Mark Allen, who's
 5 the acting deputy division director of the
 6 litigation division at our office, and then also
 7 Karl Rysted, who's one of the current administrative
 8 prosecutors.

9 They've been great. All of the work that
 10 comes before this board has been a part of the work
 11 that they do in terms of the disciplinary matters,
 12 so I just wanted to thank them and give them an
 13 opportunity to be here and thank you all as well for
 14 the network's work on the board.

15 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Thank you. I'd also
 16 like to take this opportunity to congratulate Chief
 17 Tim Johnson. I'm sorry he wasn't here in person.

18 But I understand that after serving as a
 19 law enforcement officer since the Lincoln
 20 administration, he's finally decided to hang it up.

21 He has had a very distinguished and
 22 auspicious career, and his leadership at the New
 23 Mexico State Police is something that I think is,
 24 from my perspective first as district attorney and
 25 now as attorney general, has really been admirable,

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1 and I just want to take this opportunity to
 2 congratulate him on all his years of service and
 3 hopefully will still see him in some capacity in his
 4 role in public service in the future.

5 Thank you, Chief Johnson.

6 With that, I'd like to turn now to the
 7 director's record, and we'll hear a report now from
 8 Director Baker.

9 MR. BAKER: Good morning, folks. Benjamin
 10 Baker. I'm the interim director of the New Mexico
 11 Law Enforcement Academy, the deputy cabinet
 12 secretary for the department of public safety.

13 Welcome members of the community, friends
 14 from the attorney general's office who I haven't
 15 seen in a while, board members, our attorney general
 16 in his second and last meeting. Congratulations on
 17 a successful tenure.

18 Our friends from the administrative
 19 prosecution side from the AG's office and our DPS
 20 staff and employees, on behalf of the secretary,
 21 welcome you to be part of the staff.

22 I'm going to talk a little bit about some
 23 of the accomplishments we've made, starting with why
 24 we're sitting in this room. Sitting in this room,
 25 which is smaller than what we were in last time. We

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1 moved next door, followed by this room probably why
 2 we're having to borrow it is receiving over \$300,000
 3 worth of audio and video upgrades and will put us on
 4 the cutting edge of technology for our students.

5 The room next door is being outfitted for
 6 two 196-inch monitors on one side of the room, and
 7 at least for a short period of time until technology
 8 advances, we will be one of the most innovative
 9 learning platforms that exist, I'm told, and we're
 10 super grateful for that. That was due to the
 11 dedication and hard work of the folks here at the
 12 New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy.

13 The construction project is going on, and
 14 obviously we're on the clock for two reasons, you
 15 know, fiduciary and economic deadlines associated
 16 with the end of the year. But more particularly we
 17 are in between academy classes. We just graduated
 18 one of the largest academy classes in the last ten
 19 years last month. We begin one next month. We
 20 anticipate equal standing and equal number of folks
 21 coming.

22 I also want to thank you for being here --
 23 I was remiss not to mention it -- we have a couple
 24 of satellite academy directors with us today. I'm
 25 grateful for their attendance here. They will

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1 become members, voting members, of the standards and
 2 training council. We're grateful for their
 3 continued work and dedication to our shared kind of
 4 product here, our students and our training, but
 5 also their attendance here showing their support.
 6 So I'm grateful for that.

7 AV upgrade you guys have heard about.

8 Also, thank you, Robin. Robin has been
 9 here. Many of you guys have seen her over the
 10 years. She obviously doesn't say much, but she's
 11 recording all of the things that we say, and so I'm
 12 grateful for her and her work. Court reporting is
 13 something I've learned a bunch about during my
 14 tenure here that somehow escaped me during the
 15 previous 25 years of sitting in the courtroom.
 16 Mostly because of the proximity. And as she's
 17 typing below the table the words that are coming out
 18 of my mouth, I just want to make sure that she
 19 understands how grateful we are for her services and
 20 being part of this board.

21 Made some significant moves during the
 22 tenure that we have had as this board and as part of
 23 the board's work. So I want to make sure it's
 24 reported to you.

25 When I took over, we had a 19 percent fill

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1 rate in the classification of law enforcement
 2 academy and instructors. That is not good enough,
 3 and I think we all agree. Made some significant
 4 efforts and moves related to interfacing with our
 5 state personnel office, related to how antiquated
 6 that classification was, and how it was computed.
 7 Keeping up with the times, we got their support
 8 through a couple of iterations of testimony.
 9 And between that date -- those are one
 10 year ago, so July and September of last year -- got
 11 their support and approval. We now have a
 12 14 percent vacancy rate in that. And so we are down
 13 to one staff member to fill. So literally flipped
 14 it from one to the other in terms of the atrocious
 15 vacancy rate to now I think it's something to be
 16 proud of and something we work to continue to
 17 improve.
 18 We also, as was mentioned by the attorney
 19 general earlier, will be facilitating the onboarding
 20 and the -- the kind of once-in-a-generation
 21 legislative and instructional change that this place
 22 is undergoing as we speak, as we welcome in the
 23 standards of training council and certification
 24 board to take on the work that has currently been
 25 conducted for the many decades by this board.

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1 So we've worked really hard to make sure
 2 that we can equip the staff here at DPS with the
 3 proper horsepower to address that, and in doing so,
 4 I was awarded 19 full-time employees to support and
 5 forward that mission, so we will be undertaking that
 6 the moment that it is permissible to do so and be
 7 looking forward for folks to find new opportunities
 8 here at DPS.
 9 Also forgot to mention -- introduce Lily
 10 Romero. She was integral in helping us on the
 11 misconduct side preparation of this meeting. Board
 12 members received thousands of pages of documentation
 13 prior to this meeting for the purposes of doing
 14 their work, and Lily was largely responsible for
 15 that. So thank you, Lily, for your involvement in
 16 this process.
 17 Pivoting to hearing officers, there are
 18 structural changes that are important here. These
 19 will continue on irrespective of which boards go
 20 forward.
 21 The hearing officers employed by the
 22 New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy for decades have
 23 been used to do exactly what was explained earlier
 24 by the attorney general, is conduct the formalized
 25 hearings, which is an important part of the

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1 due-process rights of our law enforcement and public
 2 safety personnel accused of misconduct.
 3 Those look like trials for folks who have
 4 experience with that. The people who are the
 5 adjudicator and are the sounding board are these
 6 hearing officers.
 7 Those hearing officers, I learned during
 8 my time there, hadn't had a pay raise in decades, so
 9 I changed their pay rate, raising them from \$50 an
 10 hour to \$75 an hour. We also changed the mechanism
 11 by which they're compensated to a professional
 12 services contract instead of just simply a PO for
 13 procurement.
 14 Both of those things took significant time
 15 and effort but were well worth the effort, because
 16 it will provide the consistency and continuity for
 17 the due-process rights of this process and the work
 18 that is done here.
 19 We have upped -- on this board's approval
 20 of the last meeting, we have upped our total count
 21 of hearing officers to five to support the cases.
 22 I'm about to explain to you why that is so
 23 important.
 24 We have a full laundry list of discipline
 25 matters that you will hear today, and I'll get to

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1 that analysis in a while so I don't take a ton of
 2 time on this. We had some public training that we
 3 conducted within the recent past and some that's
 4 coming up in the future.
 5 Coming up in August we have the Public
 6 Safety Resiliency Summit, and the New Mexico Law
 7 Enforcement Academy is a sponsor. On October 10th
 8 through 13th, we will be hosting a Mexican cartel
 9 investigation class here. And the 26th and 27th of
 10 October, Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving
 11 Enforcement, kind of standardized classes. These
 12 are for all New Mexico law enforcement officers, and
 13 it's offered free of charge.
 14 You're going to hear my presentation later
 15 for police officer/public safety telecommunicator
 16 graduation interpretation petitions for your
 17 approval.
 18 We just graduated the largest class that
 19 we've had in ten years. As I mentioned, seated
 20 directly to our right is the certified class
 21 involved, and they will join the ranks of law
 22 enforcement agencies from all over the state. Very
 23 excited about that. They will graduate next Friday,
 24 and public safety telecommunicator class 159 begins
 25 directly after that and will be in this room, and

<p style="text-align: right;">14</p> <p>1 it's at capacity, so this is exciting.</p> <p>2 We talked a little bit last meeting, but</p> <p>3 in case anybody missed it, we were the grateful</p> <p>4 recipient of a significant donation from the Sandia</p> <p>5 National Labs related to de-escalation training and</p> <p>6 use of force simulation. We've had multiple</p> <p>7 requests to use it and have been able to accommodate</p> <p>8 those. That also is used to train students in the</p> <p>9 training classes.</p> <p>10 Some of you were here for our law</p> <p>11 enforcement memorial held on May 23rd. It's hard to</p> <p>12 keep a count, because it's busy, but we suspect that</p> <p>13 there were close to 1,000 attendees here, which is a</p> <p>14 significant number of folks. It was a really -- it</p> <p>15 was a really great ceremony. Obviously not a</p> <p>16 celebration insofar as we enshrined seven folks to</p> <p>17 that wall outside in our garden, but I think that</p> <p>18 the feedback that I received relative to the work</p> <p>19 done by this staff and the agencies from all over</p> <p>20 the state that participated was very well-received,</p> <p>21 and we are grateful to be able to serve in that</p> <p>22 manner.</p> <p>23 27 cases you will hear today. Just by way</p> <p>24 of kind of summary for your information, 24</p> <p>25 allegations of misconduct received in the review</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">16</p> <p>1 I wanted to share with you a couple of</p> <p>2 summary data since this is our last meeting of this</p> <p>3 iteration of this board. Obviously this work will</p> <p>4 continue. Many of the personnel involved will</p> <p>5 continue, certainly on the staff side here.</p> <p>6 I think it's important to understand, and</p> <p>7 it accentuates a couple of points that were raised</p> <p>8 earlier by the chair. 14 months since I have been</p> <p>9 here and have been able to personally observe kind</p> <p>10 of what these things look like.</p> <p>11 This staff and the folks who work on these</p> <p>12 cases have brought to your attention 121 cases for</p> <p>13 adjudication, but I think what's more important than</p> <p>14 the number of cases that have been brought to you</p> <p>15 and the high number of volume, which it is, are some</p> <p>16 of the timing considerations that are a little less</p> <p>17 clear just inside the stats.</p> <p>18 When we examine today's agenda, for</p> <p>19 example, you will observe the overwhelming way in</p> <p>20 which the 27 cases you are going to be looking at</p> <p>21 are contemporary. They were received in either in</p> <p>22 2023, 2022, or 2021. When you look at the ratios,</p> <p>23 2021, there's three of them.</p> <p>24 I did a little math to determine what the</p> <p>25 efficiency ratio of this meeting and others like it</p>
<p style="text-align: right;">15</p> <p>1 stage, six which are in the notice of investigation</p> <p>2 stage, 17 which are in settlement discussions and</p> <p>3 resolution.</p> <p>4 Historical cases -- it's important to go</p> <p>5 forward. Seven cases in the notice of contemplated</p> <p>6 action or administrative prosecution process, and</p> <p>7 five cases which are pending informal hearing, which</p> <p>8 is why it's so important to have that stable of</p> <p>9 competent and available hearing officers.</p> <p>10 We have zero cases for the first time in</p> <p>11 my tenure here that are pending here in the court.</p> <p>12 Since we last met we have noticed</p> <p>13 immediate temporary suspension on two license</p> <p>14 holders charged with felony offenses and is</p> <p>15 something that happens, and law enforcement has the</p> <p>16 capability and ability to immediately seize the</p> <p>17 suspension of the licenses of those practitioners</p> <p>18 upon arrest, which we do.</p> <p>19 We have five cases which a notice of</p> <p>20 appeal has been filed with the court related to a</p> <p>21 discipline or a denial issued or rendered by this</p> <p>22 board against the licensee or a prospective</p> <p>23 licensee.</p> <p>24 27 you will hear today, and ultimately</p> <p>25 seven of them are for your consideration.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">17</p> <p>1 would look like so we could understand what that is</p> <p>2 representative of, and 89 percent of the cases you</p> <p>3 hear today are from this year. And it's June. I</p> <p>4 think that's meaningful and important.</p> <p>5 I'm going to give you some information</p> <p>6 from the December 2021 meeting, which is a matter of</p> <p>7 historical fact by looking at the records. The</p> <p>8 efficiency ratio for the 26 cases that the</p> <p>9 New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy Board saw on that</p> <p>10 date was 65 percent. And what's not captured in</p> <p>11 that statistical analysis is there was some 2015s,</p> <p>12 some 2016s, some 2017s.</p> <p>13 And the reason why I bring this to your</p> <p>14 attention is I think it's a testament to the work</p> <p>15 that this board has put in. The staff here can</p> <p>16 gather the cases, the prosecutors can do the work, I</p> <p>17 can do the work on trying to settle matters that are</p> <p>18 appropriate for that resolution. We have to get</p> <p>19 here, and you guys have to do your work, and I think</p> <p>20 the last 14 months' worth of data and the vector</p> <p>21 that we're on illustrates that we've made a</p> <p>22 significant impact. That expediency to the correct</p> <p>23 resolution, both directions. Sometimes it's</p> <p>24 revocation, sometimes it's dismissal, and sometimes</p> <p>25 it's a version in between. But getting that matter</p>

<p style="text-align: right;">18</p> <p>1 adjudicated promptly is an important part to 2 delivering justice.</p> <p>3 If it's delayed for years and years and 4 years at a time, I think it can be distilled, 5 diluted to the place it doesn't work.</p> <p>6 We're really grateful for the work. We've 7 made that a priority here in the state offices, and 8 it's paid off. I think the board is to be 9 congratulated to get us across the finish line.</p> <p>10 At this moment, I want to express my 11 gratitude to the board for their work. So we just 12 talked about what they did during the time, but 13 what's not clear maybe to the members of the public 14 is the difficulty associated with making decisions 15 related to licensed professionals in the public 16 safety space, and it is significant, and it's 17 difficult, and those who have endeavored it will 18 understand what I'm talking about.</p> <p>19 But I want to thank the board for their 20 commitment to their absolutely necessary public 21 service to a process that helps restore, in some 22 cases, or maintain the public's trust in our 23 licensed professionals who maintain a significant 24 amount of influence and power in their communities 25 and for their willingness to be open, honest, debate</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">20</p> <p>1 only is this my last meeting because of the change 2 of the boards, it's also myself and Chief Johnson's 3 last meeting based off our terms, and so I would 4 like to thank the governor for this opportunity.</p> <p>5 I wasn't sure what I was walking into many 6 years ago, and of course COVID made it something 7 else, but I appreciated it. I learned a lot. One 8 thing I really learned is that law enforcement 9 officers are a lot tougher on other law enforcement 10 officers than people may realize, so I also wanted 11 to congratulate Chief.</p> <p>12 I'll see him in a bit, but, Chief, I know 13 I texted you earlier, but I'll talk to you today, 14 but I did want to give a shout out to chief. He's 15 been something else. He really has. And he will be 16 missed by people in New Mexico.</p> <p>17 I'd also like to encourage the board, and, 18 number one, thank the board staff. Thank you. 19 Staff members, thank you. You guys have made being 20 on this board -- again, minus COVID stuff -- 21 relatively easy, and so thank you for everything 22 you've done.</p> <p>23 Finally, I just wanted to thank all the 24 law enforcement officers out there. At this time, 25 especially in my own and the state police with the</p>
<p style="text-align: right;">19</p> <p>1 in their positions, and most importantly show up and 2 do the work, which is high volume, and I'm grateful 3 for their time.</p> <p>4 At this instance, I'd like to yield the 5 remaining time that I have in my report. Any board 6 members who would like to say anything about that. 7 You are all serving in your last meeting. Sounds 8 like the chief had something to say to what the 9 attorney general had mentioned about his tenure.</p> <p>10 I just wanted to provide an opportunity to 11 make sure that you are properly recognized for the 12 work you put in, and if you have anything you want 13 to address during this open space, then I will yield 14 my time for that and obviously stand for any 15 questions that the board has.</p> <p>16 CHIEF MIRABAL: Chief Summer Mirabel. I 17 just wanted to express my gratitude to you, 18 Mr. Baker. You've done a wonderful job, and it is 19 very impressive seeing the difference in capacities, 20 and it was really amazing how much work you put in 21 and how, you know, the ladies here put in a lot of 22 really good work. And I just want to say thank you.</p> <p>23 And also congratulate chief on his 24 retirement. Thank you.</p> <p>25 MR. TEDROW: Mr. Chair, thank you. Not</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">21</p> <p>1 tragic situation we had up in Farmington a couple 2 weeks ago, I couldn't have asked for better 3 responses from my sheriff's office, from Farmington 4 police and from the state police. And so just a 5 thank you everywhere to law enforcement out there, 6 and thank you all for this opportunity.</p> <p>7 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Are there any further 8 comments or questions for -- go ahead.</p> <p>9 OFFICER WILLIAMS: Hence Williams.</p> <p>10 Mr. Baker, I just wanted to say thank you 11 for the opportunity. Anytime I had a question or a 12 concern, your staff or you responded immediately, 13 and everything that you have put together every time 14 we come here, I just haven't had the opportunity to 15 be part of a professional organization that handles 16 everything so well. I don't say that lightly, 17 because I could have just sat here and been quiet, 18 but it's certainly a thing that needs to be said.</p> <p>19 Where we go forward from here, I want you 20 to know -- I think I said this to you privately. 21 I'd like to continue to be a part of this.</p> <p>22 Selfishly, it's an opportunity for me to grow and 23 learn, but I also know it's an opportunity for me to 24 help my agency grow as well, so thank you very much 25 for that.</p>

<p style="text-align: right;">22</p> <p>1 Chief, I want to say thank you to you. 2 You may not remember, but back in 2020 you were 3 coming down to Albuquerque quite a bit, and the 4 leadership that you demonstrated, I'll never forget. 5 You gave a speech once, which I'm not going to 6 regive here right now, but it was extremely 7 motivating at a time when serving as a law 8 enforcement officer wasn't necessarily easy but 9 certainly something that everybody in that room 10 wanted to do at the time. You made it a whole lot 11 easier by giving a speech that motivated all of us 12 to continue to do the right thing. 13 So thank you very much for that, Chief. 14 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Thank you again 15 Director Baker. I want to just congratulate you and 16 thank you and your staff for all the hard work that 17 you've put in. It's clear that substantial progress 18 was made under your leadership, and hopefully that 19 continues under this next iteration. 20 With that, I will turn to public comment. 21 There's an opportunity for individuals wishing to 22 comment. They should have signed in on the sheet. 23 I -- I don't actually see any names here, but I 24 would open it up now to anyone who is present who'd 25 like to make public comment at this time.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">24</p> <p>1 CHAIRPERSON TORREZ: Thank you, Director 2 Baker. At this time I will entertain a motion to 3 approve the law enforcement certification of cadets 4 listed in Exhibit A. 5 MR.
