10.28.6.8 JUSTIFICATION AND AUTHORIZATION: The Council will prepare guidelines to be used to evaluate proposed training. Such guidelines shall be updated as necessary by the Council.

10.28.6.9 COURSE ACCREDITATION PROCEDURES

A. The academy shall establish procedures for the submission and accreditation of in-service, advanced law enforcement training classes, and advanced telecommunicator training classes.

B. Any class that creates a standardized statewide curriculum shall be approved by the Council.

C. When accrediting classes, the academy has the authority to review the material for appropriate curriculum design, to ensure that the lesson plan includes citations and references to its source material, and to ensure alignment with any statewide standard curriculum established by the Council.

D. Lesson plans in approved academy format, any testing material, instructor information, and citations of all reference material must be submitted to the academy no less than 30 days before the anticipated start of a class. This packet may be submitted by email, by registered mail with a return receipt, or by some other means that documents when the packet was sent to the academy.

E. If the academy denies the accreditation of a class, the academy shall communicate the reason in writing to the individual who submitted the class for accreditation.

F. The academy has 30 days to accredit or deny accreditation.

(1) If the academy has not accredited or provided a written denial of course accreditation within the 30-day period, the class may still be taught with the accreditation number being added retroactively once the class is accredited, as long as the class is taught 30 days or more after the submission date.

(2) If the academy denies an accreditation for a course that has been taught at or beyond the 30-day submission date, the instructor shall communicate in writing with each student within five business days after the class is denied.

(3) If the academy denies an accreditation for a course that has been taught at or beyond the 30-day submission date, and the instructor corrects the identified deficiencies, the course shall be accredited retroactively to the date of submission.

G. Any disagreement with an academy decision regarding course accreditation may be sent to the chair of the Council as a request for consideration as a meeting agenda item.

H. The instructor can use any instructional modality, including but not limited to in-person training, online training, or a hybrid of in-person and online training, to teach a class, as long as the modality for teaching a particular class is not specifically required in statute. A course does not have to be reaccredited if the instructor changes the teaching modality during the period that the class is accredited, as long as the curriculum does not change.

I. Classes must be reaccredited every two years.

J. The academy shall make changes to any Council-approved statewide curricula when the academy is notified of changes to state or federal law that affect a particular class. The academy shall provide this updated curriculum to instructors upon request. The academy shall notify the Council of any and all changes made.
